

Man arrested in neighbor's shooting

A man was taken into custody after authorities say he shot another man in the shoulder during a dispute in Fall River Mills on Wednesday.

Robert Kevin Innes, 59, allegedly fired a handgun three times at his neighbor Gary Weaver, 54, whom he accused of trespassing at his property line. Shasta County sheriff's deputies were called about 10:40 a.m. about a dispute in the 23000 block of Cassel Fall River Road.

While en route, officers learned that shots had been fired, said Sgt. Quentin Johnston. Deputies got word that Weaver drove himself to Mayers Memorial Hospital with a gunshot wound to his shoulder that wasn't life-threatening, Johnston said.

Weaver told them Innes had confronted him at their property line and accused him of trespassing. After an argument, Innes pulled out a handgun and fired three shots, the last one striking his shoulder, Johnston said.

Deputies spoke with Innes, who denied shooting Weaver. Deputies collected evidence and interviewed a possible witness. Then, they arrested Innes on suspicion of attempted murder and took him to the Shasta County Jail.
